Dan Mondloch - Supply List

Your normal watercolor painting supplies will work great for plein air, use whatever you are used to and comfortable with. If you are new to plein air painting, I recommend testing your gear by setting up in your backyard a few times and painting a picture prior to the workshop. You will find out quickly what you need and don't need by going through the motions. I stand while painting, if you plan on sitting, bring a light folding chair. I set up a backpack with my supplies so I can be more mobile – the only thing I carry in my hands is my palette.

Palette, Tripod & Board

For Plein Air painting I use the <u>En Plein Air Pro setup up: Advanced Series Watercolor Easel</u>. If you have a tripod already, you can just purchase the board and palette.

Paper

Please bring a pad of cheaper watercolor paper for value studies as well as good quality paper that is 100% rag cotton, quarter sheet size, for paintings. I often use Arches or Sunders Waterford 140lb Rough.

Paint

I use a combination of American Journey and Winsor & Newton paints, use whatever brand and colors you're used to. A few colors I use a specific brand and that brand is noted in parenthesis after the color. I would strongly recommend having white gouache on your palette. My palette consists of:

Use what you're comfortable with; I use a combination of flats and rounds, both synthetic and natural hair. Several options are listed for Large and Medium brushes, one for each size is fine.
